NOTE

In some cases it was difficult to determine the precise day on which a branch was organized, either because the mission and branch histories fail to mention it or different dates are given (including date the organization of new branch was announced, date first missionaries were assigned, date missionaries left Santiago for the new branch, date first meetings were held).

Except where a branch is listed as the division of an existing branch, the dates shown here reflect the arrival of the first missionaries assigned to a new branch, although in a few cases only the month is given and sometimes that was an educated guess.
